The Network is comprised of one major trauma centre, one specialist neurotrauma centre, ten trauma units and one local emergency centre, and our pre-hospital care providers.


# Pan London management of elderly trauma guidance

The Pan London Major Trauma System launched the Pan London Elderly Trauma Management Guidelines on 13th February. Multidisciplinary clinicians, nurses, therapists and network managers from across the PLMTS devised, developed and reviewed the guidelines. The guidelines can be downloaded from the link below.

Each Trauma Unit should aim to implement and locally adapt the guidelines, specific engagement from Geriatric Medicine and Radiology colleagues for whom significant changes apply to elderly trauma patients is essential. The Network will audit improvements later in 2018.



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
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### Repatriations


The NELETN Repatriation Policy went live on 1st June 2017 and the new single point of contact referral process quickly began demonstrating results. A reduction in wait times from time of referral to repatriation was seen across the Network and we would like to thank everyone involved for the hard work in making this happen. The challenge now comes in maintaining and building on this progress while managing winter pressures. This is an up to date table of current waits across NELETN, shown in bed days. NB: There were no repatriations to UCLH in September– November
